a **set of skills** by which a person **self-manages** his or her education and work activities by collecting, analysing and organising information related to himself or herself, education and employment.

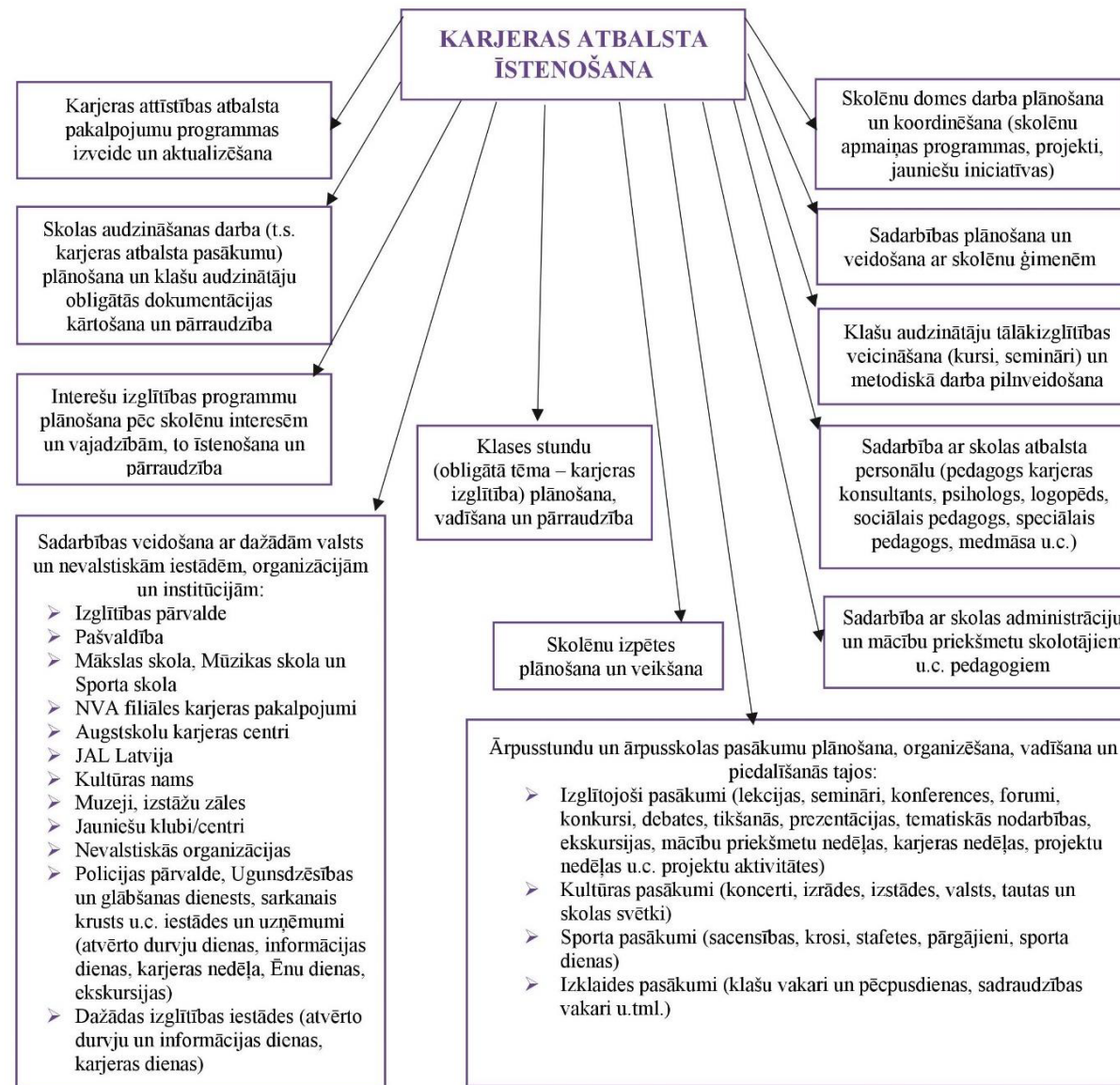

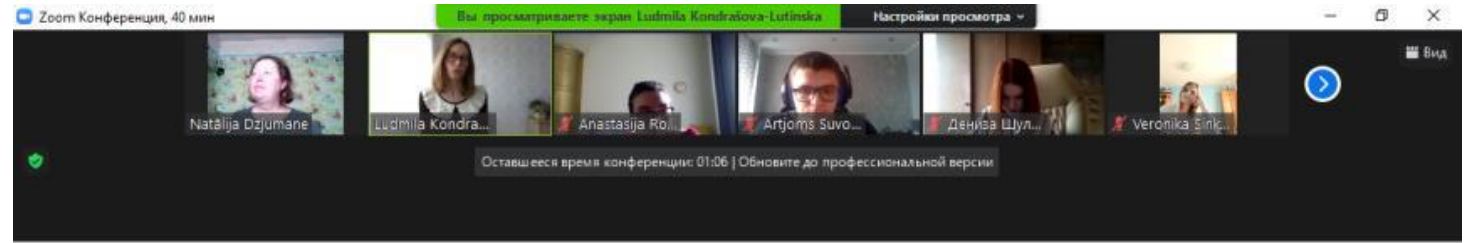

Group counselling

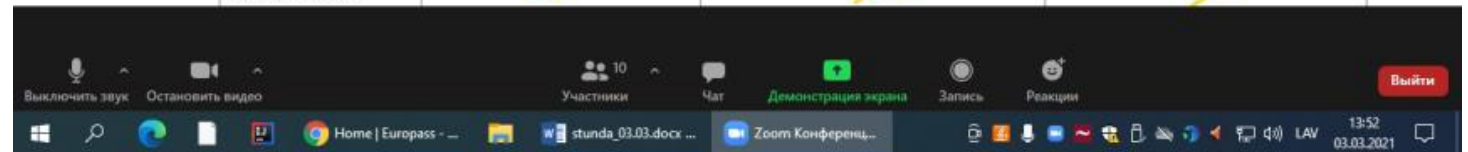
10th form students indicate what skills they learned that day in the integrated IT / career education lesson
